

Second Sunday of Advent



BACKGROUND ON THE GOSPEL READING

This week and next, our Gospel readings invite us to consider John the Baptist and his relationship to Jesus. John the Baptist appears in the tradition of the great prophets, preaching repentance and reform to the people of Israel. To affirm this, Luke quotes at length from the prophet Isaiah. John baptizes for repentance and for forgiveness of sins, preparing the way for God's salvation.

The three Synoptic Gospels—Mark, Matthew, and Luke—attest to the importance of the baptism of John in preparing for Jesus. Only the Gospel of Luke, however, extends the connection between these two men to their birth. The first two chapters of Luke's Gospel contain the Infancy Narrative, which tells about the births of John the Baptist and Jesus. These stories set the stage for the beginning of Jesus' public ministry in chapter 3.

The evangelist Luke is the author of the Gospel that bears his name, and he also wrote the Acts of the Apostles as a continuation of the story of Jesus and the Church. In these two works, Luke's sense of time and history emerges. He identifies three epochs of salvation history: the time before Christ, the time of Christ, and the time of the Church and the Holy Spirit. In today's Gospel reading, as elsewhere, John the Baptist is presented as the figure who bridges the time before Christ and prepares the way for Christ's own ministry.

In today's Gospel we also note Luke's attention to political and historical detail. Luke shows that salvation is for all people and situated in world events. Therefore, Luke lists the political and religious leaders at the time of John's appearance in the desert. Salvation is understood as God's breaking into this political and social history.

John's preaching of the coming of the Lord is a key theme of the Advent season. As John's message prepared the way for Jesus, we too are called to prepare ourselves for Jesus' coming. We respond to John's message by repentance and reform of our lives. We are also called to be prophets of Christ, who announce by our lives the coming of the Lord, as John did.

Saints & Special Observances of the Week

Mon, Dec 9: The Immaculate Conception of the Blessed Virgin Mary, Patronal Feast Day of the United States of America.



Today, we celebrate the patronal solemnity of the United States and the greatest of Mary's Advent festivals. Originating in the 7th c. feast of the "Conception of Mary by St. Anne," Pope Clement XI, in his Bull, *Commissi Nobis*, established this solemnity for the entire Church in 1708; patroness of the United States of America, Spain, Tanzania, and the Democratic Republic of the Congo. On that day we remember Mary's conception in the womb of her mother (and nine months later, on September 8, we celebrate Mary's birth). In this liturgy, we affirm our belief that God prepared Mary to be the mother of the son of God by allowing her a share, from the moment of her conception, in the salvation that would be won for all by Christ.

Tues, Dec 10: Our Lady of Loreto.

Recently added by Pope Francis to the Roman Calendar, the Optional Memorial of Our Lady of Loreto recalls the mystery of the Incarnation. Since the Middle Ages, veneration for the Holy House of Loreto has powerfully illustrated the evangelical virtues of the Holy Family. A Marian Liturgy, also known as the Litany of Loreto, has its first-known origins at the Shrine of Our Lady of Loreto (Italy), where its usage was recorded at early as 1558. Our Lady of Loreto is the patron saint of aviation.

Wed, Dec 11: St. Damasus I, Pope.

Damasus, died 384; preserved papal archives; devoted to the relics and resting places of the martyrs; combated the anti-pope Ursinus, Arian and Donatist heresies; first pope to speak of Rome as "the Apostolic See"; encouraged Jerome to produce a new translation of the Latin Bible, later to form the main part of the Vulgate.

Thurs, Dec 12: Our Lady of Guadalupe (USA).

Today's feast recalls the apparitions of Mary at the hill of Tempera from December 9-12, 1531 to the native convert, Cuauhtlatzin (Juan Diego); while he was on his way to a Eucharistic celebration in Tlatelolco, Mexico, known to the Aztecs as *Tecoatlaxope* (or *de Guadalupe* in Spanish), meaning "she will crush the serpent of stone"; Thus Our Lady of Guadalupe remains the enduring icon of unity-in-diversity, the fruit of our one baptism into Jesus, her Son; raised to the rank of feast for all the countries of the Americas.

Fri, Dec 13: St. Lucy, Virgin, Martyr.

Lucy, died probably in Sicily c. 304 under Diocletian; because of her name, she is the patroness of those afflicted with diseases of the eye and associated with festivals of light, especially in Scandinavia; patroness of Syracuse and all Sicily.

Sat, Dec 14: St. John of the Cross, Priest, Doctor of the Church.
John of the Cross, died 1591; born in Fontiveros, Spain c. 1542; mystic and poet; ally of Teresa of Jesus of Avila in founding the reformed ("Discalced") Carmelite friars; suffered cruel imprisonment and privations by the unreformed Carmelites; authored *The Ascent of Mount Carmel*, *The Dark Night of the Soul*, *the Spiritual Canticle*, and *The Living Flame of Love*; known as the "Mystical Doctor." Discalced Carmelites today number over 4,000 religious.


